- (b) On the control pedestal, set the SFCL (1) to the FULL (DOWN) position.
- (2) Lock the SFCL (1) with the GSE 029.
- (3) On the CBP, open these circuit breakers and put a circuit breaker ring and tag (inoperative do not operate) on each one of them:
  - FLAP ACE 1-LHCBP (DC ESS BUS 1 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
  - FLAP ACE 2-RHCBP (DC ESS BUS 3 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
  - SLAT ACE 1-LHCBP (DC BUS 1 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
  - SLAT ACE 2-RHCBP (DC ESS BUS 2 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
- (4) In the middle avionics compartment, open this circuit breaker and put a circuit breaker ring and tag (inoperative do not operate) on it:
  - HYD1 PUMP PWR-RICC (AC BUS 2)
  - HYD2 PUMP PWR-LICC (AC BUS 1)

(5) With the flaps and slats extended, clean them as follows:

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- NOTE: During the cleaning procedure of the flaps and slats, do not expose the components (actuators, harness, skew sensor) in contact with chemicals product.
  - During the cleaning procedure of the flaps and slats, make sure that you do not remove the lubrication from the system components.
  - Do not wash the aircraft with the flaps and slats extended.
- (a) Do the manual cleaning by applying the alcohol TT-I-735 with a lint-free wiper cloth, on the area that was covered during the aircraft washing.
- (6) Do these steps to retract the flaps and slats:
  - (a) On the CBP, remove the circuit breaker ring and tag (inoperative do not operate) from each of these circuit breakers, and close them:
    - FLAP ACE 1-LHCBP (DC ESS BUS 1 FLIGHT CONTROLS)

    - SLAT ACE 1-LHCBP (DC BUS 1 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
    - SLAT ACE 2-RHCBP (DC ESS BUS 2 FLIGHT CONTROLS)
  - WARNING: MAKE SURE THAT THE FLAP CANNOT BE OPERATED ACCIDENTALLY. AN ACCIDENTAL OPERATION OF THE FLAP CAN CAUSE INJURY TO PERSONS.

  - (b) Remove the GSE 029 from the SFCL (1).

  - (c) Set the SFCL (1) to the 0 (UP) position.
  - (d) Make sure that the flaps and slats are retracted.
- (7) In the middle avionics compartment, remove the circuit breaker ring and tag (inoperative do not operate) from each of these circuit breakers, and close them:
  - HYD1 PUMP PWR-RICC (AC BUS 2)
  - HYD2 PUMP PWR-LICC (AC BUS 1)

The high pressure water and chemical solvents can force dirt, contamination, and moisture into bearings, bushed joints, actuator seals, electrical connections, faying surfaces, and structural joints, causing corrosion, increased maintenance cost, and unserviceability.
  - (b) Fully dry the nose and main landing gear wheelwell with a lint-free wiper cloth.
    - NOTE: During the cleaning procedure of the landing gear wheelwell, do not spray water on gears, wheels, brakes, harness and connectors.
      - The fluid can go into the joints or bearings and cause premature wear and corrosion.
      - Make sure that the cleaning solution was fully removed.





*EFFECTIVITY: ALL* Static Port - Cover Procedure Figure 302


